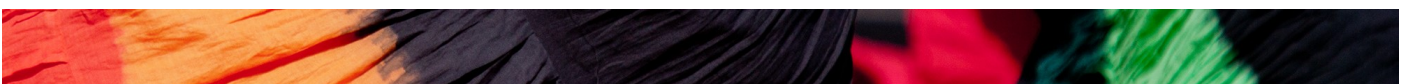
I take this opportunity to thank our funders and supporters, whose logos are shown below. Without them this festival would not have happened.
